The AmpleHarvest.org Campaign was created because many backyard gardeners who grow more vegetables, fruit and herbs than they need wanted to share their bounty with the hungry in their community, but often could not find local a food pantry. This excess food was instead left to rot in the garden, composted or simply thrown away.

According to AmpleHarvest.org founder Gary Oppenheimer, “The AmpleHarvest.org Campaign is working to diminish hunger in America by enabling millions of backyard gardeners to donate their excess garden bounty to local food pantries. At the same time, nearly 500 people a week were coming to the web site in hope that they might receive some of the help they so desperately need. Although AmpleHarvest.org is not able to provide anyone with food assistance, it certainly can point these individuals to the resources that can best help them in their own communities, and that is what this enhancement to the AmpleHarvest.org web site does. They get the help they need and we can remain focused on the bigger picture”.
