The Challenge

Local and state agencies work hard to reduce food insecurity and improve health outcomes. Yet many communities still struggle to provide consistent access to fresh, nutritious food, especially in rural areas and underserved neighborhoods.

At the same time, millions of home and community gardeners grow more food than they can use. Too often, that food never reaches neighbors in need, not because people do not care, but because they do not know where or how to donate it, and local agencies are not always easy to find.

Our Solution

AmpleHarvest.org removes the barriers that historically prevented gardeners from donating their surplus harvests to local hunger-relief agencies.

We do this by solving two root problems:

1. Missing information: where to donate locally
2. Misinformation: confusion about if fresh produce donations are accepted and where/when to do it

AmpleHarvest.org does not move, store, or handle food. We make donation possible by making the right information easy to find and easy to trust.
